I. Welcome

Jim King called the meeting to order at 6:40 PM.

II. Introductions

The attendees introduced themselves. A quorum was present.

III. Approval of June Minutes

Minutes for the June meeting were approved.

IV. Admit Any New Member Neighborhoods

No new neighborhoods asked for admission to BCN. Twenty-seven neighborhoods had paid 2011 dues as of this meeting. Elizabeth Prichard commented that action is under way to organize the Brandon neighborhood and define its boundaries.

V. Committee and Liaison Updates

- Executive Committee No report.
- Communications Committee Bob Schneider has identified a few options for a BCN web site: one would be under \$500; another would be under \$100. He said that a web designer in his neighborhood (Mike Floyd) had offered to do the set up for free.
- **Education** Jim King reported that he had asked BOE Chair Brenda Mohammad to update us on the status of the cheating scandal she made come soon (next month?)
 - Gordon Certain said that the AJC had been instrumental in exposing the CRCT cheating and that he hoped the reporters who worked the story would get the Pulitzer Prize. He asked BCN to commend the AJC for their contributions to the city for their investigative reporting on CRCT cheating. His **motion** was passed unanimously. A BCN letter was sent to the AJC. The AJC sent an e-mail of appreciation and published BCN's letter in the July 26 AJC. See July 2001 section of www.nbca.org/BCN/Minutes/.
- Parks Gordon Certain reported that his neighborhood will be working on a new park on Mountain Way in the area around a GA 400 overpass bridge. A neighborhood meeting in planned in early August.
 - Garth Peters mentioned the Buckhead Coalition's grant program for pet waste stations. The kits cost \$300 and are available to neighborhoods for \$25 each. A consolidated order will be placed in late July for at least 40 units.
- **Property Taxes** No report.
- **Public Safety** Hannah Chung (Zone 2 Community Prosecutor) reported on cases she had been involved in:
 - Sentences were issued to five who shoplifted the Belk's at Phipps Plaza and were promptly arrested. One got 15 years to serve 5; three got 10 years to serve 8; and one got probation and is banned from Phipps Plaza.
 - Another case involved a burglar who had afflicted NPU-D and was arrested for burglarizing Carolina Lumber and Supply – he got 20 years to serve 7.
 - o Another person was implicated in three burglaries in Garden Hills in April. He got 20 years to serve 3.

Hannah's office and the Fulton Burglary Task Force are working on a trial program to mark copper pipes in air conditioning units to see if that deters copper theft and sale as scrap. She is seeking volunteers.

Jim King asked Hannah about the status of DA Paul Howard's reply to the request BCN made a year ago to pursue the CRCT cheaters. Hannah offered to contact Howard to see if she could get an update.

- Redistricting Jim King reported on a June 30 reapportionment hearing. He, Jim Elgar and Gordon spoke. Jim and Gordon asked for all of Buckhead to be included in a single State Senate district. Gordon said the commitment was made that proposed maps would be available at the beginning of the August 15 special session and that the public would be able to make comments to the Legislators. Jim made the motion that BCN wanted the neighborhoods in the Buckhead Community to be in one State Senate district. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.
- Transportation, Development and Infrastructure Debra Wathen reported that she, Jim King and Paces Battle representatives had met with GDOT Commissioner Vance Smith. The discussed the proposed widening of US 41 at the Chattahoochee and southward. GDOT proposed a revised plan which preserved Paces Battle's buffer Paces Battle is very appreciative for BCN's help.

Jim and Debra found out that an *inter-governmental agreement* was in the works in the City Council Finance Committee – it would give Cobb County the right to condemn property in Atlanta for a six-lane US41 down to Mt. Paran Road. The City Council held

up the inter-governmental agreement rather than approving it.

Debra encouraged us to research possible Transportation Improvement Act (TIA) projects that might affect our neighborhoods. • Watershed Department – Buff Quillian reported that backflow valves are now being required on residential irrigation water meters. The code was written in 1977 but is just recently being enforced. The valve sits 12" above the meter and it adds \$300 or \$400 a year to the cost of the installation. She said that it was intended to prevent backflow of contaminants such as fertilizer. She felt that since the pressure was greater on the city side of the valve than the customer side, she didn't understand the concern about the backflow – she suspected residents are being punished for trying to avoid sewer charges. Gordon Certain commented that in cases where the residence was significantly above the level of the meter and if there was (liquid) fertilizer in the irrigation system's lines, there would be nothing to prevent backflow without the valve. Jim King said he didn't understand why there would be an annual charge.

VI. Speakers - Fire Chief Kelvin Cochran

Chief Cochran's presentation was the Strategic Plan of the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department. The plan is for the city's fiscal years 2012 through 2016. Rather than to attempt to reword his presentation in these minutes, the reader is encouraged to revisit Chief Cochran's presentation at www.nbca.org/BCN/Minutes/AFR%20Strategic%20Plan.pdf. This comprehensive 50-page document includes a detailed discussion of the department's ten strategic initiatives, including staffing and resource requirements. We are grateful to Chief Cochran and his staff for this interesting presentation.

In the Q & A session afterward, Jim King asked if the department had considered mutual aid agreements with Cobb County to help improve the 4-minute response times for western Buckhead which are not currently adequately covered. Cochran said it was possible but that they hadn't explored it. He asked Captain Wright to do a review of call volumes and responses and provide a report to BCN.

He also commented that they hoped, when feasible, to combine future new fire stations and police precinct offices in a single facility.

Cochran said that they were working on a regional emergency evacuation plan which should be available in about six months. He suggested that BCN invite Matthew Kallmyer of the Atlanta Fulton County Emergency Management Agency to brief us on the plan when it is available.


