#### I. Welcome & Introductions

**Jim King** called the meeting to order at about 6:35 PM. The attendees introduced themselves. A quorum was present.

## II. Approval of April Minutes

Minutes for the April meeting were approved.

#### III. Admit New Member Neighborhoods

Twenty-eight neighborhoods paid 2011 dues. As of this May meeting, thirty neighborhoods had paid 2012 dues. No new neighborhoods asked to be admitted.

## IV. Neighborhood Governance Issues

**Kathy Collura** said the Georgia Secretary of State's office had determined that certain non-profit organizations had been overcharged when filing their annual registrations. The refund will be through credit card if originally paid that way.

**Jim King** said his Chastain Park neighborhood currently has 532 households registered on their **NextDoor** social network site. A map of all Buckhead neighborhoods has been loaded into the NextDoor site to make activation of neighborhood sites easier. Jim encouraged all neighborhoods to try it out.

**Tiffany Harlow**, the new **Zone 2 Community Prosecutor**, introduced herself. Her office is responsible for prosecuting "quality of life" crimes in our neighborhoods: burglaries, car break-ins, etc. She will work closely with Major Hobbs.

## V. Speaker - APD Zone 2 Commander Major Van Hobbs

**Major Van Hobbs** is the new commander of APD Zone 2, succeeding Major Browning who is now commander of Special Operations.



Major Hobbs started with APD 23 years ago. He was promoted to sergeant and assigned to the airport where he gained experience in internal investigations involving problematic personnel. He was transferred to Internal Affairs where he worked with the Law Department in drafting charges against officers and with Chief Howard in administering discipline. Promoted to lieutenant, he moved to the Training Academy and became a certified POST trainer (Peace Officers Standards and Training Program). He was then moved to Recruitment where he revised training policies and worked with departmental accreditation and reaccreditation. He was later responsible for downsizing the property (evidence) room area by 75% when it moved out of City Hall East. This required extensive reworking of evidence systems, policies and procedures. He was then promoted to Night Commander and then Zone 6 Assistant Commander. Most recently he was

promoted to major and sent to Zone 2.

He answered a series of questions previously provided by BCN directors. He said if there were noise violations call 911, even if there are off-duty officers hired by the neighborhood as a security patrol. All calls to 911 are logged; he stressed that police resources (staffing) are allocated on the basis of call volume. He said the 911 operators will prioritize calls, so don't worry about calling about minor issues. The Noise Ordinance is being redrafted and he expects that officers will be trained to enforce the new ordinance with calibrated noise meters.

He provided a flyer on the new Community Oriented Policing Section (COPS). See http://nbca.org/BCN/Minutes/2012-05-10%20APD%20Flyer.pdf.

He discussed the APD and State Patrol high-speed chase policies in some detail.

Hobbs said that Zone 2 wrote 892 traffic citations the previous week. He said that the emphasis on traffic is because traffic cases lead to bigger cases. His experience is that more people are arrested as a result of traffic stops than from police patrols.

## VIII. Speaker - Buckhead Heritage Society's Erica Danylchak

**Erica Danylchak**, Executive Director of the Buckhead Heritage Society, spoke to BCN about how neighborhood history can be discovered and documented and how her organization can help.



Erica worked in the archives of the Atlanta History Center before joining BHS two and a half years ago. Erica has worked closely with the North Buckhead Civic Association over the last several months to "uncover" some of the lost and little-known history of North Buckhead and presented her report at the NBCA Annual Meeting in March.

BHS was founded in 2006 and their first project was the restoration of the Harmony Grove Cemetery. In the upcoming days they plan a lecture on the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Orly Plane Crash and a joint art exhibit and auction with Midtown. Proceeds from these events will support the neighborhood history project Erica discussed later in her presentation. BHS is also collecting oral histories. Their web site at BuckheadHeritage.com has videos and transcripts of

interviews.


BHS was invited to participate in the Buckhead Greenspace Action Plan project. The project leadership realized that there were opportunities to integrate historic interpretation and preservation into the greenspace plan. Erica worked with the project's consultant to map known historic resources in Buckhead. See map of Council District 7 at right. She wants to work with neighborhoods to create a similar map for the rest of Buckhead. She noted that there were large areas of District 7 which were empty, with no known history. North Buckhead (circled in red) in particular was almost completely empty as the result of its agricultural heritage. She saw a great need to talk to residents of North Buckhead as part of this larger ambitious plan to integrate Buckhead history and greenspace.


So far she has contacted North Buckhead, Memorial Park, Pine Hills and Buckhead Forest. One of her purposes in addressing BCN is to make contacts with the right people in other Buckhead neighborhoods.



She outlined the process that she used with **Gordon Certain**, Blue Heron Nature Preserve's **Nancy Jones**, and other volunteers. Because of the lack of information about North Buckhead in standard sources, a History Day was planned as part of North Buckhead's annual Fall Fling. Oral histories were recorded and maps and photographs were displayed in the Blue Heron conference room to spur the recollections of attendees. Stories were collected and important sites identified.

To help organize available information and to highlight where more work was needed, Gordon outlined a North Buckhead History Resource Workbook. The workbook started with just chapter headings for each significant neighborhood site or event. Later each chapter was populated with random emails received over the years, maps, photographs, web pages and related articles on each topic. The purpose was not to have a finished document that might be published but to organize what was known. The document currently has over 130 pages and is still a work in progress with some empty chapters and much work to do on those





which have been started. A map annotated with a star for each chapter is part of the resource workbook provides the geographical context for each discovery. (This workbook is online for those who want to see how it is organized. It is huge – 46 MB – so it has been split into four parts for easier downloading. See <a href="https://www.nbca.org/History\_Day/index.htm">www.nbca.org/History\_Day/index.htm</a>.)

Erica reviewed some of the highlights of her presentation to North Buckhead's membership. Among the most interesting tidbits is that one of the oldest cemeteries in Buckhead, the Lowry-Stevens Cemetery which dates from the early 1850s, is in North Buckhead on Loridans Drive. It will be restored and is planned to be one of the key destinations at the northern termination of the GA 400 Trail. The GA 400 Trail is the turning out to be the backbone of the Buckhead Greenspace Action Plan project. So the plan to tie greenspace to history is moving right along.


