A Brief Summary of the Proposed Changes to the Mt. Paran/Northside/I-75 Intersection Scheduled for completion in 2013:

- The plan includes <u>two</u> lanes on the I-75 south ramp: one for a forced right-turn only onto Northside Pkwy north and a second one to enable a right-turn lane onto Mt. Paran west from which cars can go straight or turn left onto Northside Pkwy south. (Currently, there is a single lane existing I-75 southbound.) There will be a concrete median between the two lanes on the I-75 south ramp to avoid weaving on the ramp and, more importantly, a new traffic signal at the intersection of Mt. Paran and the I-75 south ramp. The signal will stop Mt. Paran westbound and I-75 south traffic, while Mt. Paran eastbound traffic will not be affected. As is currently the case, there will be no left hand turn allowed onto Mt. Paran allowed off the I-75 ramp.
- There will be a crosswalk across I-75 south exit ramp in order to comply with federal regulations.
